



Sports Funding 2019/20 and 2020/21

The School Sport Premium Funding is allocated through a lump sum and a small per pupil top up and can only be spent on sport and PE provision in school.

Amount received for 2019/20 £17 838.00

The carry-over to 2020-21 is £7309

We used this money in 2019/20 to maintain what we have achieved over the last few years in PE.

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We believe that this is the most effective and efficient way for the funding to have a long lasting and positive effect on future learning and physical development of children within our school.

Impact 2019/2020

Staff have had the opportunity to work alongside professional sports coaches to increase their expertise

Coaches work with staff to monitor pupil progress and data is monitored by subject leader.

35% of pupil in the school have accessed after school activities provided by professional coaches and staff. This has been impacted by the Covid-19 restrictions, therefore only Autumn term 2019 and Spring 20 half term 1 were available for after school activities.

Pupils entered for all competitions in the Autumn term in the cluster events.

Most pupils have engaged in activities or sport for 2 hours or more in a week. This has been achieved through PE lessons, break time activities, the use of the all-weather track for running and walking during break and lunch times.

Introduced the Golden Mile to the Infant children at afternoon break

General resources purchased to enhance sports provision

Girls only after school club introduced to increase girls participation.

Cross curricular activities improved – e.g.: dance linked to learning.

100% of Year 6 pupils achieved the 3 swimming and water safety national curriculum requirements.

2020/21

Amount predicted: £ 17 800.00

How it will be spent:

Employ sports coaches for one day a week to deliver high quality sports provision and provide staff with training. This is covered over two half days – Tuesday and Friday.

This year an additional hour a week dedicated to working with children after their return from lockdown and focussing on children who just need a time to talk during sport, focusing on their well-being.

Employ sports coaches to deliver before and after school sports provision as well as holiday clubs.

Paying a % of PE teacher's salary at local high school to organise and co-ordinate inter school sports and deliver high quality lessons in our own setting.

We are hoping to provide further swimming training for teachers who accompany the pupils swimming depending on the lockdown restrictions.

Sports coaches continue to monitor children's engagement / effort and progress in PE, and provide data to evidence progress.

Updating equipment to enhance lessons and for new skills.

Hiring of both Village Hall and Goostrey Scout Hut to accommodate after school clubs.

Impact to be reviewed summer 2021 and throughout the academic year with PE lead and PE governor.

Enhance the all-weather track on the school field to support and involve more children in targeted activities.

Encourage Year 5 and 6 pupils taking on leadership roles on the playground as sports leaders.
