Dear Parents.

Coronavirus— we have talked with the children this week about effective hand washing and reinforced the message: Catch It, Bin it, Kill it. We are receiving information daily from GOV.UK and it is still stating schools should stay open at the moment. Senior managers and Chair are continually reviewing our practice and risk assessments to maintain an appropriate response and lessen any risk as far as we can. These may change in the future and we will keep you informed through the newsletter or messaging service. We will continue to take advice from Public Health England and Cheshire East. Please make sure we have all up to date contact details for your family, that we are aware if you have been in contact with anyone who has tested positively for Coronavirus or you have been in close contact with anyone who has recently visited any of the high risk areas in the world and if you are having to self isolate. Thank you

PC Liz Chesters came to school last Monday and delivered a session to Year 6 on internet safety and being responsible online. She also offered individual, 1 to 1, talks which several pupils found useful. Many of our children, in the junior classes, access sites at home which they are not old enough to use. We are increasingly getting reports of online behaviour, outside of school, that upsets other children. Please be aware of what your child is doing online to ensure their safety as well as the wellbeing of other children.

School had a very relaxed feel to it yesterday, as the children (and staff) moved around very quietly in their slippers for World Book Day. I'm thinking of keeping my slippers in school now!



TAKING CHILDREN ON HOLIDAY DURING TERM TIME

A guide for parents and carers

Frequently asked questions

Am I entitled to take my child out of school for a family holiday?
□ No. Parents have a legal duty to ensure that their children attend school or the alternative provision on a regular basis
☐ The Education Act 1996 makes it a criminal offence for a parent to "fail to secure their child's regular attendance at the school"
□ The amendments to the 2006 Regulations remove any reference to <i>family holidays, extended</i> leave and the statutory threshold of ten school days.
☐ The amendments make clear that Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence (holiday) during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances
☐ The amendments give parents no entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time
☐ The Head Teacher and Governing Body will determine what the exceptional circumstances are
If we decide to take a holiday during term time what should we do?
☐ The parent/carer with whom the child resides must apply in writing to the school ☐ The letter/application must explain the exceptional circumstance surrounding the request for the leave of absence
What will the school do then?
☐ The Head Teacher will determine whether the exceptional circumstance ruling applies, if not the application will be declined
o Only the Headteacher (or the Deputy) has the power to approve leave of absence applications. When making the decision the protocols and criteria laid down in the school's attendance policy must be followed.
 Each academic year, schools inform parents/carers via a letter, newsletter or some other communication; that they may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice if their child has unauthorised absences in term time
☐ You will receive a written response from the Headteacher (or the Deputy) letting you know if your application has been approved
☐ If the holiday goes ahead after the application has been declined the absence will be recorded as unauthorised

what will happen if the absence is unauthorised?
☐ The school will decide if a Penalty Notice should be issued. If the school decide that a
Penalty Notice is to be issued
☐ You will receive a letter from the school advising that it has referred the matter to the Local
Authority and that a Penalty Notice may be issued;
☐ The school will inform the Local Authority that a Penalty Notice needs to be issued
□ A Penalty Notice will be sent to you, accompanied by an explanatory letter; the Notice gives you the opportunity to pay a penalty fine instead of being prosecuted in the criminal courts

Timeline	One child	Two children
Paid within 21 days	£60 per parent	£60 per child = £120 per parent
After 21 days and before 28 days	£120 per parent	£120 per child = £240 per parent
After 28 days	You will receive a summons to appear before the Magistrates' Court on the grounds you have failed to secure your child's regular attendance	You will receive a summons to appear before the Magistrates' Court on the grounds you have failed to secure your children's regular attendance

Payments will **not** be accepted after the 28th day and payments **cannot** be paid in part or by instalments
