We are really pleased that **Chloe** has passed Stage 4 Swimming. She has worked really hard. Well done Chloe






We are very proud of **William H** in year 1 for getting his 5m swimming badge!

# **Junior Tennis Coaching Programme 2020**

Children wanting to begin at tennis, or looking to improve their playing skills, could take part in this year's Goostrey Junior Tennis Coaching at the Boothbed Lane courts.

The 15-session programme by LTA Coach David Richardson runs from Friday April 24th to Saturday September 26th – excluding school holidays and Rose Day weekend. There's a choice of sessions on Fridays in the early evening or on Saturday mornings, and school-age children are grouped according to LTA junior coaching guidance for age and ability.

Junior coaching is open to children aged between 5 and 16, with sessions ranging from beginners and 'parent-and-child' classes, to more advanced coaching for older children. The programme is structured, with the emphasis on having fun whilst learning and developing tennis skills and ability.

Participation is open to juniors who live in Goostrey and the adjacent parishes of Allostock, Over Peover, Lower Withington, Twemlow, Cranage and Swettenham, whose families are already VHPFF members – or entitled, through living in the above parishes, to apply for VHPFF membership. The cost for the junior coaching programme's 15 sessions is £67.50 (cheques payable to 'Goostrey Tennis Club'). There will also be an Easter holiday camp for children, from Monday April 6<sup>th</sup> to Friday April 10<sup>th</sup>, with warm -up sessions, games, fun drills and competitions – before the weekend coaching programme begins. These will be held at the Boothbed Lane courts from 10am to 3.30pm each day. Booking is available by the day, or there is a special rate for all five days. # TAKING CHILDREN ON HOLIDAY DURING TERM TIME

# A guide for parents and carers

Frequently asked questions

Am I entitled to take my child out of school for a family holiday?
<ul> <li>No. Parents have a legal duty to ensure that their children attend school or the alternative provision on a regular basis</li> <li>□ The Education Act 1996 makes it a criminal offence for a parent to "fail to secure their child's regular attendance at the school"</li> </ul>
☐ The amendments to the 2006 Regulations remove any reference to <i>family holidays</i> , <i>extended</i> leave and the statutory threshold of ten school days.
☐ The amendments make clear that <b>Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence</b> (holiday) during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances
☐ The amendments give <b>parents no entitlement</b> to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time
☐ The Head Teacher and Governing Body will determine what the exceptional circumstances are
If we decide to take a holiday during term time what should we do?
☐ The parent/carer with whom the child resides must apply in writing to the school ☐ The letter/application must explain the exceptional circumstance surrounding the request for the leave of absence
What will the school do then?
☐ The Head Teacher will determine whether the exceptional circumstance ruling applies, if not the application will be declined
o Only the Headteacher (or the Deputy) has the power to approve leave of absence applications. When making the decision the protocols and criteria laid down in the school's attendance policy must be followed.
<ul> <li>Each academic year, schools inform parents/carers via a letter, newsletter or some other communication; that they may receive a Fixed Penalty Notice if their child has unauthorised</li> </ul>
absences in term time ☐ You will receive a written response from the Headteacher (or the Deputy) letting you know if your application has been approved
$\ \square$ If the holiday goes ahead after the application has been declined the absence will be recorded as unauthorised

What will happen if the absence is unauthorised?
☐ The school will decide if a Penalty Notice should be issued. If the school decide that a
Penalty Notice is to be issued
☐ You will receive a letter from the school advising that it has referred the matter to the Loca
Authority and that a Penalty Notice may be issued;
☐ The school will inform the Local Authority that a Penalty Notice needs to be issued
□ A Penalty Notice will be sent to you, accompanied by an explanatory letter; the Notice gives you the opportunity to pay a penalty fine instead of being prosecuted in the criminal courts

Payments will **not** be accepted after the 28th day and payments **cannot** be paid in part or by instalments
